



## SCHOLARSHIP & GRANT RENEWAL

Students receiving a renewable scholarship or grant must meet the requirements for each award in order to renew for the following academic year. If requirements are not met, the award is subject to nonrenewal in the following academic year.

**Alumni Award:** A minimum GPA of 80 at the end of each semester of each academic year. No major discipline issues. Maintain good attendance. Involvement in at least one extra-curricular activity.

**EdChoice Scholarship:** EdChoice Scholarships are available through the Ohio Department of Education. Eligible students can apply between February and April and must complete renewal documents each year. Students must remain in good standing with attendance.

**Honors Program Scholarship:** A minimum GPA of 85 in all courses at the conclusion of each quarter. Grades are reviewed at the end of every quarter for continuation within the program. Students are required to follow Honors Program contract.

**John Zeiser Scholarship:** A minimum GPA of 80 at the end of each semester of each academic year. Must demonstrate good citizenship. Must be active in both parish and community.

**Lautenbach Family Fund:** A minimum GPA of 80 at the end of each semester of each academic year. No major discipline issues. Maintain good attendance. Involvement in at least one extra-curricular activity.

**Performance Grant:** Maintain passing grades at the end of each semester of each academic year. No major discipline issues. Maintain good attendance. Involvement in at least one extra-curricular activity.

**Placement Award:** A minimum GPA of 80 at the end of each semester of each academic year. No major discipline issues. Maintain good attendance. Involvement in at least one extra-curricular activity.

**All Named Awards:** For students receiving a renewable named award (i.e. Corry Character, Marlene Menchen, Paul "Hans" Frey, etc.), a minimum GPA of 80 at the end of each semester of each academic year. No major discipline issues. Maintain good attendance. Involvement in at least one extra-curricular activity.

# Financial Aid & Conduct

Confidentiality: Financial aid awards are considered confidential. It is expected that families receiving assistance will treat it as such. Disclosure of specific information may impact a family's current and/or future awards.

Participation in Fundraisers: All Students are expected to participate in school fundraising which benefits worthy causes and their fellow student families. Students who receive financial aid are required to participate in the annual "Walk for Others," as 80% of the money raised benefits Elder's tuition assistance program.

Enrollment: Students must be enrolled for the entire year. Aid will be prorated according to school policies for any student withdrawing after the start of the academic year.

EdChoice: Families receiving financial aid and/or scholarships who are eligible for the State of Ohio EdChoice Voucher Program are required to apply for an EdChoice Voucher. EdChoice-eligible families who do not apply for the EdChoice Voucher Program will have financial aid or scholarships reduced or rescinded.

Some scholarships or assistance awards have not yet been determined by other sources, such as your parish, CISE, EdChoice, student activity group, or private donor. Consequently, Elder High School reserves the option to reverse or adjust our award if a subsequent award is applied or if tuition is billed separately to divorced/separated parents.

Renewability: Financial aid is not renewable; however, families should submit a FACTS financial aid application every year to be considered for aid.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IS MADE AVAILABLE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING STIPULATIONS REGARDING CONDUCT

The school will take the following actions when specific demerit totals are reached during the school year.

Student receiving financial aid through Elder High School are subject to loss of a portion of the aid due to disciplinary issues.

1. After accumulating 12 demerits, the parent(s) will be notified via letter that their son is in danger of losing part of the financial aid;
2. After accumulating 20 demerits, a second letter of notification will be sent to the parent(s);
3. After accumulating 25 demerits, a third letter will be sent to the parent(s) notifying them of the loss of financial aid. The amount of financial aid loss may be as high as 50% of the total aid.

The Disciplinarian will notify the Business Manager when a student reaches the 12, 20, and 25 demerit limits.

The loss of financial aid will occur when a student accumulates 25 demerits or may be delayed to the following year at Elder's sole discretion. The lost aid will be charged back to the tuition account and is due in the month it is removed if the adjustment occurs in the same year. For students withdrawing from Elder during the year, the aid and/or scholarship grant will be prorated on a per diem basis, with the balance to be paid in full in order to release academic information to the student's new school.
